#### FROM ONTARIO DELEGATE PAUL SHAW

(Editor's note: As many of you know, this year Paul and Drew Shaw have been actively representing Canada in International (bunker) Trap around the world. As a result, they missed our 2010 Provincial Tournament and most recently they missed the NorthEastern Grand American in order to compete in the Commonwealth Games. There have been many members asking us about their recent experience in Delhi, India - so naturally we asked Paul to tell their story here in The Clubhouse!)

"I have been asked to provide an overview of Drew's and my experience at the Commonwealth Games in Delhi, India. This was a multi-sport event with 71 countries competing in 17 different sports, of which shooting was one sport. Security was very tight and we had armed escorts accompanying our buses to and from the Athlete's Village and the shooting range. The shooting facility was very acceptable with 6 fields and of course, ranges for handgun and rifle.

Drew outperformed his Dad and was 4 targets off the shoot-off round in trap with 116/125. As for double trap, Drew shot 133/150 which is respectable given the relatively minimal double trap training opportunities. I joined Drew in the double tram team events so that Canada could have an entry. We finished tied for 6<sup>th</sup> place.

It was amazing to see so many people from countries all over the world who shared a common bond – being members of our Commonwealth of Nations. Some countries I had never heard of previously. If you get a chance, read my delegate article in the December's Trap & Field Magazine as I discuss some of the characters we encountered from various countries.

It was a tremendous opportunity and Drew's first multi-sport event which he has described as 'life changing'. Sport brings people together on the playing field – even those who have political and other differences which, for a short while at least, can be set aside. The Commonwealth is still relevant and the old adage that the sun never sets on the British Empire is probably still true."

# AND NOW... A FEW WORDS FROM PRESIDENT NEVILLE HENDERSON

"Hello fellow trap-shooters. I hope you're still enjoying our sport during the off-season through league competitions or just having fun practicing for the upcoming season. Hopefully, some of you will have the opportunity to attend an ATA shoot in one of the Southern states. Many of you have in the past and made a very good showing of yourselves which reflects well on the quality of OPTA shooters.

The off-season is busy for the Board. There is a lot of preparatory work for the upcoming season and that work is underway. At our last meeting, the Board organized several groups to determine how we can improve the 2011 Ontario Championships and set up the infra-structure to ensure the changes are implemented effectively. The key areas we are working on include:

- improved administrative processes
- pro-active squad management to minimize /eliminate delays
- improved training for trap personnel regarding ATA rules and procedures
- review and updating of awards
- a contingency plan for uncontrollable delays such as weather, a power outage, or other issues.

Key issues with administration include: improving the computer system to eliminate downtime and delays and make in-putting more user friendly; increasing the number of classification stations and the pre-tournament hours available for classifying to reduce congestion; improving the cashiering process; accelerating the presentation of scores.

The Board is currently looking at an alternative system which has gotten a lot of positive support from a number of clubs about its simplicity and effectiveness. The system is currently at the Hamilton Club so our objective is to ensure it will suit our needs. We will need to acquire additional computers, however, and we may need more screens to meet our goals.

Getting squads through on a timely basis has been a perpetual problem. We will be setting up squad hustlers consisting of OPTA Directors and potentially some volunteers if needed. Additionally, all competitors will be asked and expected to take 50 shells to the line so there will be minimal downtime between 25's. There will be tight time frames which will be rigidly enforced for getting to the line and for downtime if a firearm breaks down.

There have been complaints in the past about inexperienced scoring staff and the inconsistent application of ATA rules. We will be providing training to as many scorers as possible at the start of the tournament and providing all of them with a concise, easy-to-understand summary of the most common and necessary rules to be enforced. (The Rule Book is not the place to go for quick solutions to most questions that arise!)

While our current award system is reasonable, we need to review it and determine what changes would better reward current competitors and encourage new shooters to participate - and do our current awards give good incentive to all shooters to strive for achievement?

Another area we are considering is the camp ground at Hamilton Gun Club. There were complaints last year about a number of issues including the length of the grass in certain spots and maintenance of the washrooms. In any case, the facilities should be clean and well kept. We are fortunate to have HGC's Trap Director Warren McLay on our OPTA Board, and we are supporting his efforts to see that HGC is compliant in making the entire tournament and camp grounds functional, efficient and pleasurable to all our competitors.

Our objective is to make the Ontario Championships as enjoyable and expertly managed as possible. If you have further ideas, please submit them. Your new OPTA Board is readily accessible and our contact info will continue to be published here in The Clubhouse. We will be depending heavily on you to help us achieve our objective!"
