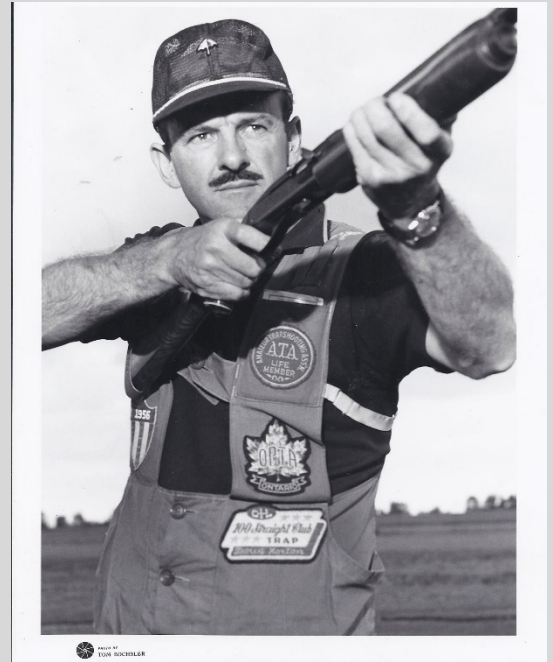


Doug Norton

Doug Norton was born June 8, 1923 in Hamilton, Ontario and was inducted into the OPTA Hall of Fame in June 1984. Doug enlisted in the Canadian Army in 1940, and served overseas as a gunner in the 5th anti-tank regiment. He was honourably discharged in 1946. He registered his first ATA targets in 1953. In his trapshooting career Doug had registered 151,000 singles targets, 68,750 handicap targets, and 61,396 doubles targets for a total of 281,146. Since 1952, Doug shot ALL three events with a Winchester Model 12 pump gun which finally wore out in 1981, when he began shooting with a Perazzi.
