## 2022 ONTARIO PROVINCIAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

**Scrimshaw blasts 98 to win handicap; Chris Tsementzis wins doubles with 100, all-around with 394.  
Beecraft captures 16s crown after shoot-off.**

Derek Scrimshaw won his first OPTA Championship, breaking a score of 98 from the 22-yard line to win the Winchester OPTA Handicap Championship, the final event of the 103<sup>rd</sup> Ontario Provincial Trapshooting Championships, held July 28-31 at the Hamilton Gun Club. Lloyd Beecraft captured his second Ontario singles crown with a score of 198 and 25 in shoot-off over Chris Tsementzis, besting the field of 182 shooters. After winning with a 99 in 2021, Chris Tsementzis left no room for error and broke his first 100 straight in doubles to repeat as the OPTA Doubles Champion. He also was victorious in the all-around with a score of 394x400. His father, Peter Tsementzis won 9 awards throughout the week, highlighted by his 15<sup>th</sup> high-over-all title with a score of 962x1000, 20 targets ahead of Scrimshaw, who collected the runner-up trophy.

Ana Tsementzis, and Lisa Bennett ran roughshod over the Lady I category, combining to win all 5 championships between them: Ana the singles, all-around, and high-over-all, while Lisa earned top honours in the handicap with a 95 and won doubles in a shoot-off, defeating Tsementzis 19-17, after both breaking 91. BJ Jackman garnered runner-up in the Doubles Championship with a score of 96 and two shoot-off rounds over Peter Tsementzis.

The Hamilton Gun Club hosted the shoot for the first time since 2018, with 194 shooters from Ontario, Quebec, and the Atlantic Provinces participating. Larry Sexton from Alabama also made the trip to continue his quest to shoot in each Canadian province and was very happy to win a silver trillium coin for his A class win in the Friday singles event. Tournament Director Dan Gris and his staff, as well as the OPTA Board of Directors and many other volunteers worked long hours to put on an efficient and well-run shoot.

In the title Singles event, Dianne Wood collected her record 18<sup>th</sup> Lady Singles trophy, and tenth consecutive Lady II title with a score of 193. Keith Saunders collected his fifth Senior Vet title, this year with a score of 197, while Randy Douez and Bob Morphy won their first OPTA singles crowns: Randy winning Sub-Vet with a 196, and Bob by defeating Frank Schneider in a shoot-off to take the Veteran award with a 194. Lorenzo Bonaiuto won his second consecutive Junior crown, and Adrian Baran captured the Sub-Junior title with a score of 183x200.

Perazzi Canada sponsored the Handicap Championship, and Verne Higgs broke a lone 97 to take Sub-Vet honours. Justin McGhie defeated Joe Di Francesco in a shoot-off to take runner-up honours, with Joe placing 3<sup>rd</sup>, both with scores of 96. Peter Tsementzis placed 4<sup>th</sup>, and James Cadigan 5<sup>th</sup> after both breaking 95, and Nebojsa Mitrovic took 2 shoot-off rounds to take 6<sup>th</sup> place over a logjam of 94s, with the other shooters taking the Open Champion through 6<sup>th</sup> place. Adam Arpa also broke 20 in the shoot-off. Lisa Bennett broke a 95 to take Lady I honours, after also winning Open Lady I in the championship 16s. Perhaps the highlight of the final day of the tournament was the shoot-off for the Sub-Junior handicap crown. Adrian Baran and Jacob Bedard tied with scores of 86, and both had never been in a championship shoot-off before this week. They battled for 3 rounds before the dust settled and Adrian was victorious. Many smiles, nervous laughs, and encouragement created a great atmosphere for the head-to-head battle.

Beecraft captured veteran hours in the championship doubles with a score of 98, and Joe Di Francesco defeated Verne Higgs 20-16 in a shoot-off to take Sub-Veteran honours. Ed Wilmott won a 4-way shoot-off to take Senior Vet honours, and Bryce Holland took the Junior crown, with a score of 86.

On Thursday, 8 shooters tied in the opening singles event with 99s. After carryover, Peter Tsementzis was declared champion and Beecraft, Ralph Zadro, Joe Borys, won their respective classes. Participants in the two preliminary Handicaps were also shooting for their home club, as the OPTA split prize money between the shooter and their respective local clubs. Brad Mann, representing the Kippen Gun Club, bested the field by 2 to win the White Flyer Handicap with a score of 96. Peter Tsementzis was runner-up, and John Costa defeated Jenn Harris in shoot-off after their 94s. Derek Scrimshaw was declared champion of the opening Doubles with a score of 96, plus carryover. Jenn Harris was apparently not satisfied with her 4<sup>th</sup> place trophy on Thursday, as she came out on Friday and smashed 96 to win the Shaine Rogers Handicap, taking a

cheque back to the Oxford Sportsmans Association for her win. Ron Rowe was ecstatic to defeat Verne Higgs, of St Thomas, 23-21 in a shoot-off, to take runner-up honours back to his home club, the Napanee & District Rod & Gun Club. Newcomer George Chen defeated long-time and accomplished shooter Frank Bonaiuto in a shoot-off for 4<sup>th</sup> place. Dave Leunissen broke his first 100 straight and won the Friday singles, after carryover.

Peter Tsementzis, accompanied by many volunteers and prominent Ontario shooters, hosted a Youth & New Shooter Clinic on Thursday night. Several youth shooters spent the evening meeting each other and being coached on trapshooting fundamentals, gun fit, and the mental aspects of trapshooting. They then went to the line to put these teachings into practice, with a dinner provided afterwards. Lew & Pat Hummason brought their two grandsons to the clinic and also donated an air-conditioned washroom trailer for the duration of the shoot. The Hamilton Gun Club donated the targets for the kids to shoot as well.

The OPTA put on an event Friday night, drawing two numbers to shoot-off for prizes. Brandon Woltz defeated the other 18 participants, winning a full set of Pilla Tomcat glasses. Vortex Canada, Winchester, as well as Perazzi also provided prizes to participants. The Hamilton Gun Club hosted a steak dinner on Saturday night, with over 75 people partaking in a delicious meal. The OPTA awarded 17 Shamrock Leather bags to HOA winners, and over \$6500 in added money was awarded throughout the shoot to winners, as well as daily draw winners.

- OFFICIAL youth program of the Amateur Trapshooting Association. (website: [www.aim4ata.com](http://www.aim4ata.com))
- Membership costs: \$13 per year (paid with ATA Membership).
- Members compete against other AIM shooters as an individual and/or member of a team.
- AIM Events are run concurrent with existing registered ATA shoots in Ontario.
- Monthly, Provincial, Zone, and special awards are calculated automatically by the ATA and mailed to winners.
- AIM members can attend the AIM Grand (held prior to the Grand American in Sparta, IL).
- Scholarships: Scholarships exclusively for AIM shooters awarded for Academics, Integrity & Marksmanship.

## OPTA “CHAMPION OF CHAMPIONS” COMPETITION

The Champion of Champions program is designed to help smaller clubs get more shooters to participate in A.T.A. registered events. Resident AND Non-Resident shooters may qualify at different clubs for the same or different event/category. Doubles payouts are higher than the other disciplines: this is designed to incentivize more shooters to shoot more Doubles targets.

### Criteria to Host

- ALL clubs that are authorized to hold A.T.A. registered events in the province of Ontario can participate.
- Big 50, “Penny Pincher”, or last-minute shoots do not qualify, but **any shoot request made 7 calendar days prior to the scheduled event date CAN be considered a “Champion of Champions” qualifier.**
- Clubs will receive a confirmation with your dates and the necessary forms for reporting the results of the shoot.
- Clubs can designate **UP TO 3 shoot dates** as “Champion of Champions” qualifiers.
- **Clubs must complete and sign the forms that are provided**- handwritten substitutes will not be accepted.
- Event qualifiers will be held on 100 target programs for Singles, Doubles, and Handicap.

### Qualifiers:

Will be awarded in each event to:

Event Champion

Junior Gold/Junior/Sub-Junior combined

Lady I/Lady II combined

Sub-Veteran/Veteran/Senior Veteran combined

New Shooter (new member in 2022-2023)

A shooter may qualify for a different category, including the event Champion category, at different qualifying shoots. In all cases, it is the qualifying shooter’s responsibility to inform the gun club which category he/she chooses to be placed in; Ties for Champion and category at qualifying shoots will be determined by sub event, reverse score. If still tied, a draw will determine the winner. In the end, only ONE person will qualify per category in any event at a shoot.

**The gun club must have the qualifying club name, event, shooter name, A.T.A. number and the type of qualification (Champion, all categories) identified on the shoot report and submitted to the OPTA Secretary.** Incomplete reports will not be accepted. A minimum of 3 shooters per event is required for the event to be considered a valid qualifier.

### Champion of Champions Competition

At the Ontario Provincial Shoot, all qualifiers will have their scores recorded for the Singles, Handicap, and Doubles from the SECOND of such events of the shoot. **Shooters who qualify as a Champion may not fall back to category if they have not qualified for said category.** Shooters may only win one prize per event. All ties will carry over to the Championship events of the Provincial Shoot and will be shot off if still unresolved.

## OPTA HANDICAP PURSE

This is a Handicap Purse option available to all shooters shooting registered Handicap targets in Ontario.

1. Each shooter will have the option to pay \$1.00 per handicap event to be eligible for the purse, although clubs may CHOOSE to include entry into the Handicap Purse as part of the entry fee. Please check shoot programs for this information.
2. \$1.00 is allocated to the OPTA Handicap Purse, with funds to be submitted to the OPTA following each event.
3. Full target and daily fees must be paid to be eligible.
4. Eligible targets: A scheduled program shoot or Big 50 event. Penny Pinchers do not qualify.

### Payout Structure

**50 straight wins 25% of the purse. 75 straight wins 50%. 100 straight would collect 100% of the purse amount.**

In the case that multiple straights are broken on the same day then the payout percentage is split. This applies also to scores broken at different clubs on the same day. Winners will be paid by the OPTA within 30 days following the event.
