Greetings from Ontario, Canada

I write this article in late May. For those of us in Ontario, most registered target matches in our province will take place over the next 90 days. That is probably the case in most of the states and provinces in the northeast. We will have two major competitions in Ontario this summer — our OPTA Provincial Championships at the St. Thomas Club between July 30 and August 1st. Ontario is also host to the Canadian ATA Championships at the Hamilton Gun Club between June 29 and July 3.

We in Ontario are often under attack by the anti-gunners and municipalities that are intent on regulating our ranges out of existence by stringent noise by-laws and discharge of firearms by-laws.

And then, of course, there are government agencies intent on controlling what firearms we can and cannot possess and for what purpose. We have no Second Amendment right to own and bear arms. In Canada, owning a firearm is a "privilege" only. For our friends to the south, your <u>constitutional</u> right to own and bear arms is continually under attack. Your next president will be appointing at least one and possibly several justices to the U.S. Supreme Court. The Supreme Court has a wide latitude in how it interprets and applies the Second Amendment.

Where do the presumptive nominees of the two major parties stand on gun control? Will Hillary preserve or erode the Second Amendment? What about Trump? If your Second Amendment is compromised, it negatively impacts us in Canada. Inter-country restrictions on firearms, even parts and ammunition, are tough already.
